Dear Judge Frank,

Pursuant to Pretrial Order No. 3, the respective counsel involved in each of the two applications submitted for leadership of the Plaintiffs in this case have met and conferred. The groups have reached an agreement on a proposed leadership structure that represents a compromise by both groups but that all believe will be in the best interest of the Plaintiffs.

Additionally, pursuant to the conversation that the Court had with us, we reached out to Tara Sutton on behalf of this newly agreed upon leadership group and discussed with her the possibility of serving as a liaison with the New Jersey state court litigation. As we understand it, Ms. Sutton has dismissed her cases that were originally part of the MDL and no longer has any pending cases before this Court. Although Ms. Sutton indicated she would be willing to serve in that liaison position, she would agree to do so only if we (the proposed leadership group) agreed that this role would not subject her or the New Jersey state court cases to any MDL common benefit assessment in the future. We advised her that we could not agree to that condition at this time because it was premature to decide what, if any, assessment should be imposed on cases at this stage of the litigation. Thus, Ms. Sutton declined to be added to our proposed slate and is not included on the proposal that we now present to the Court.

The Court should know, however, that our proposed New Jersey State Court Liaison, David Szerlag, is also involved in the New Jersey State Court litigation and is willing to serve as Liaison without any preconditions regarding common benefit assessments.

Attached is a proposed stipulated Order that represents the compromised structure. It identifies Co-Lead Counsel and a PSC structure. It also sets out the duties of those various positions.

- 1. To consult regularly with the Plaintiffs' Steering Committee and other co-counsel as may be appropriate) to determine the best strategy to efficiently prosecute, discover, prepare for trial and/or settle the MDL pending before this Court;
- 2. To present (in briefs, oral argument, or such other fashion as may be appropriate)to the Court and opposing parties, the position of the Plaintiffs on all matters arising during these MDL proceedings;
