## PLAINTIFF'S ORIGINAL COMPLAINT

COMES NOW, the Plaintiff, JOSEPH A. GODWIN, by and through the undersigned attorney, Jonathan Rotstein, Esquire, and hereby sues Defendant, C.R. BARD, INC., a New Jersey Corporation and in support thereof states and alleges as follows:

#### **FACTS**

- 1. This is an action for money damages exceeding Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00).
- 2. That the Plaintiff, JOSEPH A. GODWIN, was at all times material hereto, a citizen and resident of the State of Florida.
- 3. Defendant, C.R. BARD, INC. is a Foreign corporation, authorized by the Secretary of State to conduct business in the State of Florida, in this instance in Volusia County, Florida, as the product manufactured by Defendant, on the date of the incident which is the subject matter of this complaint, was being sold and used in DeBary, Volusia County, Florida.

- 4. At all times material hereto, the Defendant, C.R. BARD, INC. manufactured, developed and placed in the stream of commerce a product known as Mesh for hernia repair, and on information and belief, said entity did business in the State of Florida, and developed, manufactured, distributed and sold said product in the County of Volusia, State of Florida.
- 5. Upon information and belief, the Plaintiff, JOSEPH A. GODWIN, herein alleges the Defendant, C.R. BARD, INC. has transacted business in the State of Florida during the relevant time periods, including, but not limited to sales, delivery, promotion and/or distribution of 20 x a5 hernia repair prosthesis.
- 6. This Honorable Court has jurisdiction over this lawsuit in that there is diversity between the Plaintiff and the Defendants, the injuries complained of occurred in DeBary, Volusia County, Florida, and that this action is for money damages for the Plaintiff, JOSEPH A. GODWIN, that exceed Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) against Defendant, C.R. BARD, INC.
- 7. That on or about April 9, 2013, Plaintiff had surgery in an attempt to repair hernias using A 20 X 15 CM Bard prostheses, which was manufactured by Defendant, C.R. BARD, INC..
- 8. That subsequent to the surgery, Plaintiff began to feel pain, swelling, and other symptoms associated with inflection due to defective mesh.
- 9. That subsequent to the surgeries there has been numerous complaints and potential re-calls of the Bard hernia repair prosthesis products.

### COUNT I

# NEGLIGENT MANUFACTURE AGAINST C.R. BARD, INC.

- 10. Plaintiff adopts and re-alleges paragraphs 1 through 9.
- 11. Defendant, C.R. BARD, INC. had a duty to properly manufacture the  $20 \times 15$  cm hernia repair prosthesis.
  - 12. Defendant, C.R. BARD, INC. was negligent as follows:
- a. Failure to use reasonable care which resulted in manufacture and distribution of an unsafe product.
- b. Failure to use reasonable care in manufacture of its product to eliminate unreasonable risk of foreseeable injury, replacement risk of foreseeable injury, replacement and additional surgery.
  - c. Failure to properly manufacture the product according to its intended use.
- 13. As a direct and proximate result of the negligence on the part of Defendant, C.R. BARD, INC., Plaintiff, JOSEPH A. GODWIN suffered great bodily injury, resulting pain and suffering, disability, disfigurement, mental anguish and loss of capacity for enjoyment of life, aggravation of a pre-existing condition, expense of hospitalization and medical and nursing care and treatment.
- 14. Plaintiff's losses are either permanent or continuing and will continue in the future as when the 20 x 15 cm Bard prosthesis mesh was finally removed by surgery on August 6, 2015, the mesh had corroded into the Plaintiff's bowel which necessitated removal of the damaged bowel requiring Plaintiff to use a colostomy bag for the remainder of his life.

Wherefore, Plaintiff, JOSEPH A. GODWIN, demands judgment for damages, costs and interest as permitted by law.

### **COUNT TWO**

## STRICT LIABILITY IN THE MANUFACTURE AGAINST C.R. BARD, INC.

- 15. Plaintiff adopts and re-alleges paragraphs 1 through 9.
- The 20 x 15 cm Bard hernia repair prosthesis described herein is a manufactured product.
- 17. Defendant, C.R. BARD, INC. was the manufacturer and distributer of the 20 x 15 cum Bard hernia repair prosthesis placed inside the Plaintiff's body.
- 19. The 20 x 15 cm Bard hernia repair prosthesis was defective in manufacture for its prescribed and intended use as it failed to repair the hernia and caused inflection and pain and additional surgeries to Plaintiff requiring the removal of a portion of his bowel and requiring Plaintiff to use a colostomy bag.
- 20. Such defect was not reasonably noticeable to the user so as to warrant avoidance of use.
- 21. The 20 x 15 cm Bard hernia repair prosthesis placed in Plaintiff's body was defective and unreasonably dangerous condition at the time the products caused Plaintiff to have pain, inflection and undergo additional surgeries.
- 22. As a direct and proximate result of the defective and unreasonably dangerous condition of the 20 x 15 cm Bard Hernia repair prosthesis did not work properly, causing injuries, pain and permanent damages to the Plaintiff as the product corroded into Plaintiff's

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bowel causing removal of the damaged portion of bowel and causing Plaintiff to have to use a colostomy bag.

23. As a direct and proximate result of the defective and unreasonably dangerous condition of the 20 x 15 cm Bard hernia repair prosthesis Mesh, the Plaintiff suffered great bodily injury, resulting pain and suffering, disability, disfigurement, mental anguish and loss of capacity for enjoyment of life, aggravation of a pre-existing condition, expense of hospitalization, medical and nursing care and treatment.

Wherefore, Plaintiff, JOSEPH A. GODWIN, demands judgment against the Defendant, C.R. BARD, INC. for damages, costs and interest as permitted by law.
